Transfer to **Petra for full day visit**

The giant red mountains and vast mausoleums of a departed race have nothing in common with modern civilization, and ask nothing of it except to be appreciated at their true value - as one of the greatest wonders ever wrought by Nature and Man although much has been written about Petra; nothing really prepares you for this amazing place. It has to be seen to be believed. It is a vast, unique city, carved into the sheer rock face by the Nabataeans, an industrious Arab people who settled here more than 2000 years ago, turning it into an important junction for the silk, spice and other trade routes that linked China, India and southern Arabia with Egypt, Syria, Greece and Rome.



After a full rewarding day, we will proceed to Wadi Rum for a camp dinner and an overnight camping experience.

Day 2 (Monday, the 27th Sept. 2010)

Wadi Rum – Aqaba

Breakfast at Camp

4x4 Jeep –tour for 2 hours in Wadi Rum

This is a stupendous, timeless place, virtually untouched by humanity and its destructive forces. Here, it is the weather and winds that have carved the imposing, towering skyscrapers, so elegantly described by T.E. Lawrence as "vast, echoing and God-like". A maze of monolithic rocks capes rises up from the desert floor to heights of 1,750 meters creating a natural challenge for serious mountaineers.



After lunch, and the amazing sightseeing, we will proceed to Aqaba ...

In the south, the seaside resort of Aqaba provides the perfect location for rest and relaxation on the shores of the Red Sea. It offers first-class scuba diving and snorkeling with some of the most beautiful and best preserved coral reef in the world. The visitor can participate in swimming, sailing, windsurfing, waterskiing, or enjoy views of the active marine life on a ride in a glass-bottomed boat. Aqaba is renowned for its warm water and sunny weather and is a delightful destination that can be enjoyed all year round.



After enjoying the dinner and an over night at Aqaba, we will proceed to the Capital, Amman, on the third day, Tuesday the 28th of Sept. 2010.

Ajloun Castle (also known as Qal'at [Castle] ar-Rabad) was built in 1184 by 'Izz ad-Din Usama bin Munqidh, a general of Saladin, who defeated the Crusaders in 1187. A fine example of Islamic architecture, the fortress dominated a wide stretch of the northern Jordan Valley and passages to it. From its hilltop position, Ajloun Castle protected the communication routes between south Jordan and Syria, and was one of a chain of forts, which lit beacons at night to pass signals from the Euphrates as far as Cairo. Today, Ajloun Castle is a splendid sight with a fascinating warren of towers, chambers, galleries and staircases to explore, while its hilltop position offers stunning views of the Jordan Valley.

Continue to **Jerash**...

The ancient city of Jerash boasts an unbroken chain of human occupation dating back more than 6,500 years. The city's golden age came under Roman rule, during which time it was known as Gerasa, and the site is now generally acknowledged to be one of the best preserved Roman provincial towns in the world. Hidden for centuries in sand before being excavated and restored over the past 70 years, Jerash reveals a fine example of the grand, formal provincial Roman urbanism that is found throughout the Middle East.

Transfer to Pella

Modern day Pella (ancient 'Penuel', meaning 'the face of God') was so named by Jacob after he wrestled there all night with God in the form of a man or angel (Genesis 32:24-30). A massive Bronze and Iron Age temple recently discovered at Pella, in the northern Jordan Valley, is thought to be the best preserved temple from Old Testament times anywhere in the Holy Land.

Proceed to **Umm Qays**

In addition to Jerash and Amman, Gadara (now Umm Qays) and Pella (Tabqat Fah) were once Decapolis cities, and each has unique appeal. Perched on a splendid hilltop overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Sea of Galilee, Umm Qays boasts impressive ancient remains, such as the stunning black basalt theatre, the basilica and adjacent courtyard strewn with nicely carved black sarcophagi, the colonnaded main street and a side street lined with shops, an underground mausoleum, two baths, a nymphaeum, a city gate and the faint outlines of what was a massive hippodrome.
